ADVANCED WOUND RECOGNITION COURSE

The Advanced Wound Recognition Course is a 24 hour P.O.S.T. Plan IV certified course designed to enhance the student's knowledge and skills pertaining to trauma and wound recognition in the scope of death investigations. This unique three-day educational program is designed to address the specialized training needs of California's medicolegal death investigators, crime scene investigators, homicide investigators and police officers.

This course provides training to effectively investigate trauma related death scenes with conceptual knowledge, tangible competencies, and first hand experiences presented in a classroom setting. It offers first-hand knowledge, terminology, real life case studies, and comparison of case similarities, which are designed to expose learners to a vast variety of cases. The learning will be achieved with well-designed learning activities, job aids, and student driven discussions. The foundation of the course will focus on Government Codes 27491 and 27521, Health and Safety Codes 7050, 102850 and 102855, Civil Code 56.10, laws of evidence, and medical terminology.
