## **Coroner Death Investigation-Elder Abuse**

Elder Abuse Investigation is an 8 hour P.O.S.T. Plan IV certified course for peace officers wishing to learn more about the many facets of elder abuse/neglect investigations. This course focuses on assisting the first responder in identifying and investigating elder abuse related incidents. The focus will be placed on identifying the crimes elder and dependent adults are most commonly the victim of, building rapport with the victim, and identifying resources the victim may be referred to during the course of the investigation.

It provides the student with the tools, such as understanding signs of physical, emotional and financial abuse, medical terminology and laws associated with elder abuse. It offers case studies and information on resources available to aid in investigation and to better assist the victims of elder abuse.
